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Dictionary skills

Pupils learned how to use bi-lingual dictionaries to look up words from French to English and vice-versa.

Pupils thought carefully about what type of word they were looking for: a noun, a verb or an adjective. This helped them choose the right word e.g.:

I *watch* tv in the evening. (*watch* = verb)

You have a nice *watch!* (*watch* = noun)

nm = noun masculine / nm = noun feminine /
npl = noun plural

v = verb

adj = adjective.

This helped them choose the right word for 'the' in French, which you need when referring to a noun.
